










Low-Income Four-Year-Olds And Access to High-Quality Preschool (State Pre-K and Head Start)

- •Projected to reach 40% of low-income four-year-olds by 2017-2018.


Children in Full-Day Kindergarten

Families Enrolled in Evidence-Based Family Home Visiting (MIECHV-Funded), Rhode Island, 2010-2015




